Key tasks for CIP & societal resilience

- Beyond Information & Intelligence Sharing
- Foster Shared Sense Making
- A shared situational awareness across jurisdictional and mental gaps
- Avoid Failures of Imagination

Key tasks...

- Identify capacity deficits regarding:
- Preparedness & Response & Recovery
- Focus on technological capacities and on governance issues
- Reduce unclarities in advance to be able to focus urgently on situational complexities & uncertainties
- Avoid Failures of Initiative

Key tasks ...

- Coordination across multiple boundaries
- Interconnected vulnerabilities cut across geographies and jurisdictions
- Cascading effects flow widely and deeply
- CIP & societal resilience require a common purpose & a common capacity
- Avoid Failures of Coordination

Key tasks ...

- Invest in Meaning Making
- Communicate about known and emerging risks and about resilience enhancing work
- Formulate Narratives
- Address Accountability
- Construct Closure
- Avoid Failures of Legitimacy

Training through Exercises

- "Stress tests" at operational & strategic levels to build trust across stake-holders
- Expose cascading effects across sectors & societies to help identify capacity gaps
- Recognize multi-level & cross-border demands on governance
- Whole of society approach in practice: Public, private, volunteers in concert

Mobilise Critical Knowledge & Technologies for Strategic Purposes

- Research based knowledge plus experience based knowledge
- Knowledge from reliable evidence plus knowledge from leaps of foresight
- Knowledge and technologies fused and transformed into novel Practices
- Avoid Failures of Learning

- Nurture trans-boundary expert networks across stake-holder organizations
- Strengthen nodes for network based knowledge production & dissemination
- Foster holistic mind sets through scenario based training
